



Public Comment at Board Meetings Policy

Members of the public will be afforded the opportunity to address the Board of Trustees of the Cardinal McCloskey Community Charter School (the “Board”) during the designated Public Comment portion of a Board meeting.

Individuals desiring to address the Board will be required to identify themselves and, in the absence of compelling circumstances, will be limited to not more than three (3) minutes to address the Board, unless extended by the Board. Out of respect for privacy and confidentiality, the Board will not permit in public session discussion involving individual School personnel or students. Persons wishing to discuss matters involving individual School personnel or students should present their comments and/or concerns to the Principal during regular School hours. All speakers are to conduct themselves in a civil manner. Obscene language, libelous statements, threats of violence, statements advocating racial, religious, or other forms of prejudice or harassment will not be tolerated.

Persons making comment at a Board meeting will address remarks to the Board President, or whichever trustee is chairing the meeting. Persons making comment at a Board meeting may direct questions or comments to Board members or School officials only upon approval of the Board President, or whichever trustee is chairing the meeting.

The Board reserves the right to limit the total duration of public comments to fifteen (15) minutes. The Board President, or whichever trustee is chairing the meeting, shall oversee application of this policy. The Board President, or whichever trustee is chairing the meeting, shall have the right to discontinue any presentation or comment which violates this policy.
