



By the end of third grade, students should be able to read and comprehend grade-level texts, master multiplication and division facts up to 100, and write a one-page story or report with an introduction and conclusion. They should also have a foundational understanding of geography, such as identifying landforms and using maps, and be able to perform multi-digit addition and subtraction.

Language Arts

- **Reading:** Read and understand texts at or above a third-grade level, identify main ideas, and use strategies like prefixes, suffixes, and root words to figure out new words.
- **Writing:**
 - Write one-page opinion papers, reports, or stories with an introduction and a conclusion.

 - Understand the writing process (brainstorming, drafting, editing, revising, publishing).
 -
 - Write in paragraphs using transition words and experiment with different styles like narrative and persuasive writing.
 -
 - Use correct punctuation and grammar.
 -
 - Learn to write in cursive.
 -
 - Answer questions about a text in complete sentences.
 -
- **Speaking and listening:** Listen actively to a speaker and work cooperatively on group projects.

Math

- **Operations:** Master multiplication and division facts (0-12).
- **Problem-solving:** Solve multi-step word problems using multiplication and division.
- **Numbers and operations:** Read and write large numbers, round numbers, and perform multi-digit addition and subtraction with regrouping.
- **Fractions:** Understand basic fractions, including numerator, denominator, and equivalent fractions.
- **Measurement and data:** Tell time to the nearest minute, calculate elapsed time, and work with money.
- **Geometry:** Identify and find the perimeter of 2D shapes.
- **Algebra:** Recognize and write number patterns.

Science and social studies

- **Science:** Explore science topics through hands-on investigations and experiments, and understand the basic physical components of the Earth, such as landforms, water, climate, and weather.
- **Social Studies:** Learn about geography, including using directions and identifying features like the equator, and study social topics like states and economies. ● *Please review the Dolch word list below with your student each night.
